



Supporting Teaching and Learning in Schools Level 3

This part-time course will give you the necessary skills to be able to plan, implement and evaluate learning activities working alongside a teacher to support whole class activities, as well as working on your own with individuals or groups of pupils.

You must enjoy working with children and young adults, be confident in the classroom environment and have sufficient language, literacy and numeracy skills.

With a Level 3 qualification in Supporting Teaching and Learning in Schools, you could work in a variety of job roles within the education sector, eg. teaching assistant, learning support assistants, special needs, behaviour support coordinators, welfare support, cover supervisors, learning guide/coach or exam invigilation assistant.

In the future, you may be interested in studying further and enrol in an FdA Children and Young Peoples Workforce followed by a CertEd/PGCE, BSc (Hons) Combined Social Science or a BSc (Hons) Health and Social Care. Thereafter, you may find yourself working as a teacher, early years practitioner, early years manager, further education lecturer, adult education tutor, care worker, volunteer, social care worker or SEN teacher.
